HOW & WHEN IT STARTED

The first group of Mothers who Pray for their Children started in Brazil, Vitória city in Espirito Santo state, at São Camilo de Léllis Parish. The group was formed by twenty young catholic mothers, with no prayer life experience, however with a great wish to intercede for their children. The awakening to Jesus was what moved them to gather in the Church and, thus, intercede and pray, even without understanding the spiritual vocation of a mother, inside each heart there was already a thirst for God. It was the beginning of a beautiful path of Faith!

The Movement has already almost three thousand groups only in Brazil and more than 20 groups in other countries. Here in Australia there are 3 official groups, in less than two years of mission.

The first group was founded in 2011 and acknowledged by the Archdiocese of Vitória (ES) as "Mothers who Pray for their Children's Movement", having Angela Abdo as Foundress, Fr. Hadeleon Santana as Spiritual Director, Our Lady of La Salette as Patroness and St Monica as copatroness. When was the last time you experienced
